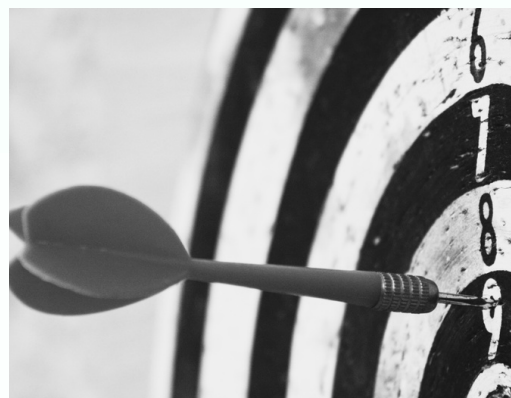
TOPIC 02

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THE PARTNERSHIP

The Pictomix partnership brings together organizations from France — **Les Apprimeurs** (experts in visual communication) and **Langues Plurielles** (specialised in language training for migrants); Italy — **Istituto dei Sordi di Torino** (focused on accessibility and deaf education); Spain — **La Lliga** (active in social inclusion and adult education); and Belgium — **EduKempen** (working in lifelong learning and community education). Together, the partners share the goal of improving access to learning for adults with low language skills, migrants, and people with disabilities, combining their complementary expertise to develop innovative, accessible tools based on visual and multimodal approaches.

FIRST MEETING IN PARIS

The first meeting of the Pictomix project partnership, bringing together all European partners, took place in Paris on January 28th and 29th. Two days of intense and collaborative work were dedicated to coordinating activities, sharing initial project actions, and planning the next phases. Partners agreed on key elements such as the development of shared myths and the upcoming release of the leporellos, marking an important step toward a common direction for the project.

FIRST RESULT

The first result of the Pictomix project is the creation of five “leporellos”, one for each partner, dedicated to stories from different European countries to showcase the continent's cultural diversity. The “leporello” is a unique accordion-style book format, designed to offer a visual, dynamic, and accessible reading experience. This activity represents an important step forward for the project, as it combines storytelling, design, and accessibility in an innovative and inclusive tool.



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
